This number later grew to seven. These Purposes are as relevant today as they were in 1929.

Delta Kappa Gamma Purposes

- To **unite** women educators of the world in genuine spiritual fellowship.
- To honor woman who have given or who evidence a potential for distinctive service in any field of education.
- To advance the professional interest and position of women in education.
- To initiate, endorse, and support desirable legislation or other suitable endeavors in the interests of education and of women educators.
- To endow scholarships to aid outstanding women educators from other countries.
- To stimulate the personal and professional growth of members and to encourage their participation in appropriate programs of actions.
- To inform the members of current economic, social, political, and educational issues so that they may participate effectively in a world society.
